People and Society in late Prehistoric Europe

University of Leicester, 19-21 June 2020

The Prehistoric Society in collaboration with the School of Archaeology and Ancient History, University of Leicester, presents the Europa Conference 2020. This year, Professor Colin Haselgrove, University of Leicester, will be honoured with the Europa prize for his contribution to European prehistory. The conference will look at issues explored in Professor Haselgrove's research on Iron Age societies in Britain and Europe, including the changing settlement landscape; objects, people, contacts and mobility; and evolving economies and power structures at the end of prehistory.

Confirmed speakers for Saturday 20th include: Prof Janet Montgomery and Dr Tom Moore (University of Durham); Prof Ian Armit (University of York); Dr Vincent Guichard (Centre archéologique européen/Bibracte); Dr Mel Giles (University of Manchester); Dr Katharina Rebay-Salisbury (Institute of Oriental & European Archaeology, Austrian Academy of Sciences); Prof Nico Roymans (Free University Amsterdam); Dr Fraser Hunter (National Museums Scotland).

This annual conference has typically attracted anywhere from 100–200 attendees, all active members of the archaeological and heritage communities.
